	loosens the hair and allows the glycolate to seep through.	
	The hair will be wound around perming rods to create the	
	curls required.	
	An oxidation lotion is applied. This contains hydrogen	
	peroxide (H_2O_2) , which reconstitutes the disulphide bonds.	
	This changes the structure of the hair and curls are	
	permanently created.	
FOILING	Individual hair strands are placed into foil and left to	NVQ level

	foil placement patterns, techniques (slicing vs. weaving) and	
	foil wrapping. Methods are generally determined by the	
	client's style and desired colour effect. Colourists may choose	
	one type or may combine various patterns, techniques and	
	wrapping methods to achieve results.	
HAIR UP	Hair is usually set in rollers or pin curls in order to make the	VRQ level 2 and

	grips to create an elegant look for weddings, proms and	
	special occasions. The hair can then be finished with a	
	setting spray/hair spray to ensure the style lasts.	
PLAITING	There are different types of plaits such as: french plaits,	VRQ level 2 and
PLAITING	fishtail plaits, cornrows and cane rows braids and Dutch	•
	plaits. There are different levels of complexities with plaiting	up
	and some plaits can be very intricate. A simple plait can be	
	completed quickly and easily using three strands of hair	
	crossed over each other. Plaiting helps the hair to stay neat	
	and in place and is very popular with children.	
MENS CUTS	Men's cuts can vary and the hair can be cut using scissors,	NVQ level 2 and
MENS COTS	clippers or razor. Different techniques are scissors over	· ·
	comb, layering and graduating. Mens cuts usually come	up
	under the term 'barbering' and hairdressers are trained in	
	this area before being able to cut mens hair as the techniques	
	differ to that of cutting women's hair.	
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
